Only Registered Students Will Write Exams Henceforth ~Registrar

By Otikor Samuel eturning Students for the 2013/14 have been directed to strictly follow the procedure for payment of charges and registration. They have also been told to complete all registration processes within the stipulated timeframe or risk being disallowed from sitting for further examinations in the University,

Registrar, Mrs. Matilda Nnodim, who gave the directive in a statement dated 9" June, 2014 and forwarded to the Editor, UniPort Weekly, said only students who pay their statutory charges and complete all prescribed registration processes would be regarded as bona fide students of the University.

According to the Registrar, returning students

are expected to pay their charges at designated banks for the respective Colleges, Faculties or School, following which they should go online to print out the payment receipt and update their Fees Pass Book with relevant officers such as the College Accountants or Finance Officers. The next step, she said, is for the students to contact either the Head of Department or their Academic Advisers to confirm their courses and register them online before printing the duly completed Course Registration Form.

The final stage is submission of online payment receipt and completed online Course Registration Form to the relevant officers in the Department or Faculty. The statement warned students to adhere strictly to the procedure or have themselves to blame in the event of infringing on the new directives.

with the Departments, Faculties and Colleges to decide according to their programmes. He, however, assured the students that his administration would do everything possible to protect the genuine interest of students, who he acknowledged were very concerned about the new method for collecting non-statutory charges.

"What we tried to do was to harmonize every payment, but since you kicked against the move, we now excised the statutory charges from nonstatutory charges and the highest fees any students will pay directly to the University is now N30, 000 and it is from students in the College of Health Sciences, Pharmacy and

Dentistry," the Vice-Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration), Professor Ethelbert Nduka said.

Joined by other Principal Officers, including the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Professor Igho Joe: Registrar, Mrs. Matilda Nnodim: Bursar, Mr Vitalis Aliezi; University Librarian, Dr Obiageli Nwodo and other Senior Officers, Management said that the non-statutory charges are minor charges such as Library Resources, Departmental and Faculty levies which are tailored to meet some needs, explaining that Science students would continue to pay a little token for laboratories use, while students in the Faculty of Agriculture and those in Year Two in the Departments of Geology (Faculty of Physical Science and Information Technology) and Geography and Environmental Management (Faculty of Social Sciences), would. however, pay for Farm Dues and Field Trip which are compulsory components in their fields of study. The Management seriously frowned at the speculation by regular students both in the social and conventional media that the now resolved fee increment were raised up to N180,000.00 and N200,000.00, stating that when Management decided to harmonize the fees, the charges rose a little over N40,000 only. Management expressed shock that the students could allow some disgruntled elements to hijack the process and portray the Institution in bad light by peddling utter

falsehood to an unsuspecting public. Speaking on behalf of the students, the Vice-President, Miss Obele Wokoma and Chief Judge, Bright Anvanwu, who promised to correct the negative publicity regarding the marginal increment in charges, sought permission of Management to meet on a later date to enable them find out the rate of nonstatutory charges which according to them, would settle the matter once and for all. They praised Management for reverting to the original charges, though with slight adjustment in portal charge occasioned by the demand of the service provider, requesting Management to ignore rumour peddlers and look up to the Student Union Executive who the students voted to represent them.
